The Department has considered your letter and enclosed newspaper reports and photographs, and, inasmuch as the complaint of alleged inhuman treatment of the prisoners in a Georgia convict camp is receiving the attention of State authorities, the Department has determined that it would not be advisable to institute an investigation at this time. Should it later develop that the State of Georgia has failed to take appropriate action, it is requested that you so advise the Department and the question of prosecutive action will then be reconsidered.
